ABOUT ORPHEUS CHAMBER ORCHESTRA

Recognized internationally as one of the world's greatest orchestras, Orpheus is a unique and revolutionary self-governing chamber orchestra, rehearsing and performing without a conductor. The Orchestra's catalog includes over 70 recordings spanning the musical continuum from the Baroque to the music of the present, for which it has won a string of awards and distinctions, including a Grammy and numerous Grammy nominations.

A self-governing organization, Orpheus was founded in 1972 by cellist Julian Fifer and a group of fellow musicians, who aspired to perform diverse orchestral repertoire using chamber music ensemble techniques. Today, Orpheus continues this philosophy, performing without a conductor and rotating musical leadership roles for each work, literally changing the way the world thinks about musicians, conductors, and orchestras. The orchestra strives to empower its musicians by integrating them into virtually every facet of the organization.

The orchestra is based at Riverside Church located on the Upper West Side near Columbia University. The orchestra's signature concert series is at Carnegie Hall in New York with additional performances in cities across the United States and North America and international tours to Asia and Europe.
